

## **AFC Report – 28<sup>th</sup> November 2009**

In the Premier Division, the only game saw mid-table sides Parkfield and Old Meadonians draw 1-1. A closely fought first half saw Meads took the lead from a Jack Costello corner. Thompson rose and provided a bullet header that was well saved but Nick Jones followed up. In the second half there were chances at both ends and Parkfield took one of theirs when a ball in from the right was smashed in at the back post by Sam Warren.
