

## **AFC Report – 8<sup>th</sup> May 2010**

Albanian are the new AFC Premier Division Champions, and they won the league title in style, beating Clapham Old Xavarians 5-1 away from home. Though they have a game remaining, against Old Minchendenians, they cannot be caught. A Steve Sergeant hat-trick and a brace from Ryan Busby led the celebrations.

Midway through the season, Old Parmiterians were favourites to win the league, but their challenge petered out, and Honorable Artillery Company continued the trend beating them 3-2. A Tom Sillick hat-trick saw HAC take a big lead, but Parm's Lewis Jones, and a Darren Blanchard volley saw them get back in the game, but they couldn't complete the comeback despite a loud penalty appeal.
